**Albert Lasker Medical Research Awards**

**In Short:**

The major purpose of these Awards is to recognize and honor individuals who have made significant contributions in basic or clinical research in diseases that are the main cause of death and disability.

**Health Topic Areas:**

Basic Medical Research, Clinical Medical Research

**Eligible Applicants:**

The Award winners may reside in any country of the world. More than one scientist may be nominated if they have worked as a team, or if they independently have made comparable contributions in their field. No more than three individuals will be considered for an Award in the basic or clinical category.

**Description:**

Basic Medical Research Award (\$50,000). This Award honors the scientist or scientists who have made fundamental investigations that open new areas of biomedical science. Clinical Medical Research Award(\$50,000). This Award honors the scientist or scientists whose contributions, directly or indirectly, have led to the improvement

of the clinical management or treatment of patients and to the alleviation or elimination of one of the major medical causes of disability or death. Special Achievement Award in Medical Science (\$25,000). It honors a scientist whose contributions to research are of unique magnitude and immeasurable influence on the course of science, health, or medicine, and whose professional career has engendered within the biomedical community the deepest feelings of awe and respect.

All nomination materials should be received by the Foundation no later than February 1, 2008.

**In Short:**

Provides funding opportunities for foreign basic and biomedical scientists, clinical investigators, nurses, and other health professionals to advance critical issues in global health upon their return to their home countries through basic and biomedical sciences research and technology development.

Supports innovative, collaborative research training programs that would contribute to the long-term goal of building sustainable HIV-related research capacity at the named low- and middle-income country institutions.

Upon successful completion of a planning grant, foreign institutions will be eligible to apply for a full AITRP award, beginning in 2010.

**Description:**

The applications for full awards should describe research-training programs that provide a variety of short-, medium- and long-term training within the context of ongoing collaborations that address the HIV epidemic and response to the epidemic in the country(ies). Applicants are expected to provide support and mentoring for trainees to conduct the research related to their training in their country to the greatest extent possible. U.S. applicants should include a plan that demonstrates the increasing research training options and responsibilities to any collaborating foreign institution during the course of the five-year award.

Valorization Grants (VG) are designed to increase the impact and sustainability of research results generated from Joint Research Projects (JRP) and Institutional Partnerships (IP). In addition, funding is made to ongoing JRP and IP which plan activities designed to improve the sustainability of project results in collaboration with other JRP and IP. VG applications can be submitted by the coordinators of ongoing JRP and IP anytime during the project as long as it is at least three months before the valorization activity is due to begin. Conference Grants (CG) enable researchers from partner countries to participate in international scientific conferences held in Switzerland by providing funding for the travel and accommodation costs of participants from Eastern European partner countries. Applications for CG can be submitted by Swiss conference organizers at least three months before the conference is due to begin.

#### **Georg Forster Research Fellowships for Postdoctoral and Experienced Researchers**

##### **In Short:**

The Humboldt Foundation grants up to 60 Humboldt Research Fellowships for postdoctoral researchers and experienced researchers annually.

##### **Eligible Applicants:**

Scientists and scholars of all disciplines from developing and threshold countries may apply to the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation directly at any time. The research proposal must address issues of significant relevance to the further development of your country of origin and, in this context, promise to facilitate the transfer knowledge and methods to developing and threshold countries. Scholars in the humanities or social sciences and physicians must have a good knowledge of German if it is necessary to carry out the project successfully; otherwise a good knowledge of English; scientists and engineers must have a good knowledge of German or English. A researcher from abroad with above average qualifications, at the beginning of his/her academic career and who completed doctorate in the last four years (postdoctoral researchers). A researcher from a developing country with above average qualifications, who completed doctorate less than twelve years ago, already has own research profile and is working at least at the level of Assistant Professor or Junior Research Group Leader or have a record of several years of independent academic work (experienced researchers).

##### **Description:**

Monthly research fellowship rates range between EUR 2,100 and EUR 3,000. Fellowship rates are set by the selection committee. A Georg Forster Research Fellowship for postdoctoral researchers allows you to carry out a long-term research project (6-24 months) you have selected yourself in cooperation with an academic host you have selected yourself at a research institution in Germany. A Georg Forster Research Fellowship for experienced researchers allows you to carry out a long-term research project (6-18 months) you have selected yourself in cooperation with an academic host you have selected yourself at a research institution in Germany. The fellowship is flexible and can be divided up into as many as three stays within three years. Extensions

may be granted in well-founded cases. Short-term study visits, participation in congresses and training courses cannot be financed.
